Mother Tongue Fortnight

The Mother Tongue Language Fortnight is a yearly event for our students. This year, our annual MTL Fortnight was held in Term 3, 4 July 2023 to 14 July 2023 during MTL periods.

The objectives of this programme are to

- Promote Active learning in the use of MTL and experience the associated culture
- Create an immersion environment that is fun and conducive for learning, exploration and appreciation of mother tongue language and culture.

Thus, an array of cultural activities of the respective Mother Tongue languages were specially arranged for students over a fortnight.

The Primary 1 students took part in sing-a-long activities. They got the chance to learn and appreciate their own Mother Tongue Language traditional folk songs, understand the lyrics and sing confidently in their own Mother Tongue Language.



The Primary 2 students had the opportunity to listen to stories from their own culture. After understanding the content of the stories, they explored creative ways of retelling the stories and with better articulation in their own mother tongue language.



The Primary 3 theme was on traditional food. Students had great fun using Playdough to create traditional food and got to bring them home upon completion.



Apart from the classroom activities, the Primary 3 students also took part in a Mother Tongue Language Cultural Camp. The photographs below depict some of the activities that the students participated in during the camp.



Primary 4 Mother Tongue Language Fortnight theme was about traditional games where students got to learn about the history and significance of the traditional games and how play them. They had a fun experience playing these games with their peers as well.



Primary 5 Mother Tongue Language Fortnight theme was about traditional arts in their own culture. Students had hands-on experience of traditional art painting in class and got to keep their completed work as memento.



P4 Swimsafer Programme

Our enthusiastic Primary 4 cohort embarked on an exciting aquatic journey for 10 weeks in Term 3. This Swimsafer programme initiative, designed to instil water safety skills and foster a love for swimming, proved to be an invaluable experience for our young learners. 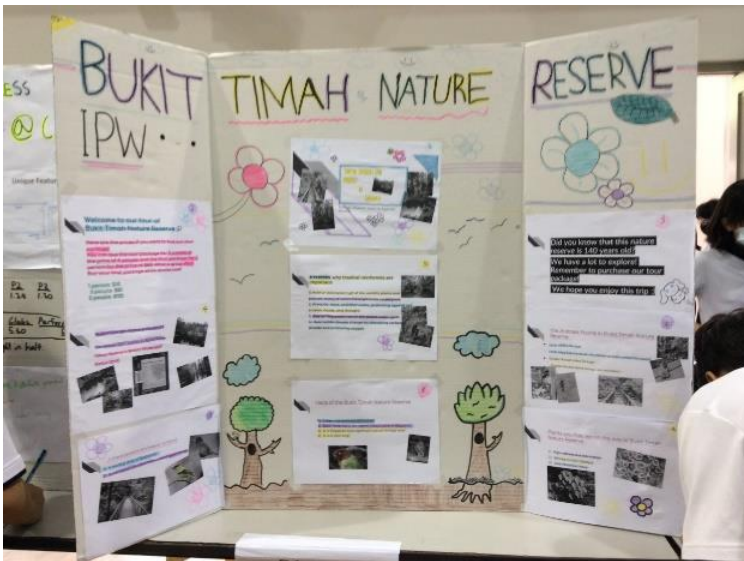
